

# Range Rules and Information

**Who can shoot:** Only current SLV Rod & Gun Members and approved guests (non-property owners) have access to the Club's Pistol Range. Club members must wear current name tags with the target stamp to shoot. There will be no use of the range without the presence of a Range Safety Officer (RSO).

**What can I shoot:** Please refer to the club's [SOP's](#) for specifics.

**Where can I shoot:** The range is located on the Huguenot Parkway, north of the Monticello Fire House. Turn down Isandiga Trail, across from Maxwell St. The street address is 254 Isandiga Trail (in case of a 911 call).

**When can I shoot:** Pistol Range hours are from 10:00am until 2:00pm (winter) and 9:00am until 1:00pm (summer). Call the Ranger on duty no later than 7:00 the evening before in order to shoot the next day. Make sure you get his/her response before heading to the range. The Club also hosts [monthly shoots](#) for all members. The Range Calendar is found [online](#); select the "Print View" button to print the current month.

## Range Safety

- All RSOs are required to complete a two-hour course, including use of a first aid kit, specifically designed for our Club. Our Chief RSO, Mike Blouin, worked with Steve Delaney, an EMT instructor with the Plum Branch Fire Department, to develop an appropriate first aid kit.
- All RSOs can be identified by a Club hat, with the RSO designation.

## Range Reminders

- Please do not hang targets from the frame. Center your target on the board.
- Before leaving the range, pick up your brass and put in the designated container; take targets down and dispose of them.
- Only brass cartridge casings go in the container for recycling. Aluminum & steel casings go in the trash as our recycling vendor is not able to reprocess them.
- If using bowling pins/heads, be sure to pick them up afterwards by placing them under the shooting table.
- Please watch for critters at the range and take the same precautions as you would at home. When moving target stands, be sure to wear work gloves. Black widow spiders have been seen on the back of the stands, plus the stands can have splinters.
